










Total area 77.4 ha









# Map of Drumalough Bog Project site










#### Map of Cloonshanville Bog Project site








#### LIFE Sites / Coillte & Biodiversity

All 14 Raised Bog LIFE sites are in SAC's
All designated areas both NHA's and SAC's are included in Coillte's biodiversity areas
Biodiversity areas – 15% of Coillte estate
Primary objective – managed for biodiversity into the future






#### Main objective

Wetting-up of project sites – this has been achieved by removing plantations, and blocking drains to raise water levels sufficiently (within 10cm of the surface) to encourage the growth of the peat forming sphagnum mosses






Map of all 14 project sites, spread throughout the Midlands

Sites 7 & 8 in Co. Roscommon






#### Aerial Photograph of section of Cloonshanville Bog taken in 2000





- Focus of PR Campaign for the Raised Bog Restoration project






# Construction of Car Park and boardwalk at Cloonshanville Bog






### Local Community Involvement






### Ongoing Work

These sites are of Irish and European importance – Raised Bog is scarce habitat – 51% of active raised bog remaining in the EU is in Ireland – we need to treasure it


